By developing and implements safe work procedures, employers ensure that all workers involved in confined space entry work follow standardized methods, reducing the risk of injury or death. These procedures will include emergency response plans and rescue procedures to be followed in the even of an accident or other emergency in a confined space.

The Workplace Health and Safety committee ensures information is assessable to all employees.

- The Manitoba Labour and Immigration Workplace Safety and Health Code of Practice For Confined Space Entry Work information sheets are located in the WSH Binder and posted on the bulletin board. All staff are shown where these are located during their training.
- As part of their training all maintenance staff are trained to identify and assess hazards before they are exposed to them.
- All confined spaces are assessed annually by the Maintenance Manager. Appendix “A” attached
