
#### Smile Cookie raises \$19 000 for local Cancer Unit



Culturama 2024 - We were well represented this year as our Tim Hortons team [including even their youngest members!] represented the Canadian food booth [our awesome








Our building is now 53 years old and it was moved in from Rocanville, SK, so it has had a lot of wear and tear on it. This beautiful building has carried us for decades. As we have said, all of the money at this time goes into the potash project, so we have very few funds to put back into the property, which will soon change. That said, last summer we spent \$150 000 on the roof of the main building and we have spent another \$100 000 this spring on the roof from rooms 201-212. Our roofer has run out of shingles. They will be back this fall to finish up to Route 83 and the 300 wing.

Meanwhile, for those of you who remember "under the big sign", we lost our sign on May 29 due to the extreme winds that we have been having.
